Fly a mission, stroll the beautiful memorial garden, and walk beneath the wings of the museum’s restored B-17 Flying Fortress, City of Savannah.

Their mission: To preserve for all Americans “the stories of courage, character, valor, and patriotism” exhibited by the men and women of the Eighth Air Force from World War II to the present.
